

Tim Baillie MBE - Canoeing



Timothy Mark Baillie MBE (born 11 May 1979 in Aberdeen) is a Scottish Slalom Canoeist who represented Great Britain. From Westhill, he competed from the mid-1990s initially in the K-1 category, but later on, switching to C-2. He gained the ultimate accolade in 2012 when he won Olympic Gold in the C2 Kayak Slalom Category, along with his Team Mate – Etienne Stott. He also took Team Gold in the European Slalom Championships in Germany. He ended 2012 as British Open Champion and was ranked 7th in the ICF World Rankings.

Kyle Coetzer - Cricket



Kyle James Coetzer (born 14 April 1984) is a Scottish cricketer who has represented his country at all levels, captaining at Under-15, U-17 and U-19 levels including skippering in the 2004 U-19 Cricket World Cup in Bangladesh. His name may sound South African, but Kyle Coetzer was, in fact, born in Aberdeen, and he achieved history in 2015 when he struck Scotland's first hundred in the World Cup - his 156 against Bangladesh being the highest score ever made by a Batsman from an Associate Nation. His first game for the full Scotland Team came in 2003 against Pakistan in a one-day Match; he appeared in four National League Matches later that season. He is a former Captain for the Scotland ODI side.

Karen Darke - Paralympian



Karen is a fulltime Athlete with the British Paracycling Team, won a Silver Medal in the London 2012 Paralympics, was World Paratriathlon Champion in 2012 and Silver Medallist in 2013, and in 2014 completed an Ironman distance triathlon, the backdrop to the film 'IMPOSSIBLE'. Karen is proud to have become Paralympic Champion in Rio 2016. Somewhat of an expert in overcoming challenges, Karen finds much of her inspiration through outdoor adventure. She was a keen Runner and Mountaineer before becoming paralysed in a Rock Climbing accident, and has since pursued alternative ways to access the outdoors – Canoeing, Sit Skiing, Kayaking and Hand – Cycling....all of which, she has done in various corners of the World. Karen Graduated from Aberdeen University in 1996 - receiving an Honorary Doctorate in 2013.
